The Sir Adrian Curlewis Scholarship is at the peak of the SLSA Leadership Development pathway which provides members with opportunities to develop themselves as leaders within surf life saving and beyond. Surf Life Saving NSW seeks nominations from interested members aged 21 years and over.

The aim of the Sir Adrian Curlewis Scholarship is to provide an environment in which individuals can harness the knowledge, experience and networks provided by SLSA to grow as an individual, with benefits for the individual and surf life saving.

The scholarship is designed around a series of teleconferences, personal development workshops and a project of choice, with other learning or promotional opportunities arising during the course of the scholarship at state and national level. The scholarship is twelve months in duration.

The ideal Sir Adrian Curlewis Scholar is a patrolling member aged 21 years or over and will have demonstrated excellent leadership performance either within surf life saving or outside the organisation. Potential scholar's will have attended leadership programs at state and or national level and appreciate that leadership in surf life saving is an opportunity to work as part of a team towards a common goal.

Applications are now being called for the 2009 Sir Adrian Curlewis Scholarship – due at state centres Friday 28 August 2009.

NOTE TO CLUB COMMITTEES/EXECUTIVES: The Sir Adrian Curlewis Scholarship is aimed at members from 21 years of age who have demonstrated performance in leadership roles either within surf life saving or outside the organisation and who show potential for future leadership roles within surf life saving. Potential scholars can come from a range of different backgrounds, interests and areas of focus within the club environment. In order for this Circular to reach the members it is intended, please follow the steps below:

1. Read the Circular in full. (Note: It is directed to the applicant).
2. Circulate it to your members 21 years of age and older: Try some of the following methods: email / (e) letter / newsletters / post on club noticeboard / word of mouth.
3. If you have any members that you think would be perfect for this scholarship take this opportunity to show recognition for their efforts and suggest they apply.
4. Follow up on your members before the application deadline to ensure they have applied.

1. IN A NUTSHELL.

The Sir Adrian Curlewis Scholarship sits at the peak of the SLSA Leadership Development pathway which provides members with opportunities to develop themselves as leaders within surf life saving and beyond.

The aim of the Sir Adrian Curlewis Scholarship is to provide an environment in which you can harness the knowledge, experience and networks provided by SLSA to grow as an individual, with benefits for you and surf life saving. While involved in the scholarship you will plot your own course through a structured self learning environment tailored to your needs – therefore no scholarship year is the same.

‘...this is your chance to enhance your leadership capabilities’

You will use the scholarship as a platform to raise your personal profile within surf life saving. There will be opportunities to capture information from passionate and influential people from all around the country, both from within surf life saving and external to the organisation. For the duration of the scholarship you will be under the guidance of mentors and state and national support staff – preparing you with the confidence and direction to exit the scholarship ready and able to take your leadership involvement in surf life saving to the next level.

2. WHAT YOU WILL GET OUT OF IT.

- Increased exposure to surf life saving programs at all levels
- Amazing networking opportunities within surf life saving and externally
- Ability to personally meet and workshop with high profile Australians
- Growth in personal leadership strength and character
- Access to SLSA and state infrastructure and administration
- And loads of opportunities beyond your wildest imagination...

3. YOUR COMMITMENT: ‘If it’s to be – it’s up to me’

Surf Life Saving Australia is committed to not just fostering great surf lifesavers but fostering great Australians. The Sir Adrian Curlewis Scholarship is designed to nurture and develop the leadership and personal skills of SLSA’s young leaders throughout a 12 month period.

‘...prove to yourself what you are really capable of and what you can really conquer.’

As a participant you will need to be dedicated to your own learning, you will be surrounded by mentors, business leaders, and role models that will coach and guide you through all areas of the scholarship. With learning in

your own hands you will need to show the passion and determination to get through when times are tough, particularly considering you are likely to come from already extremely hectic surf life saving commitments on top of any studying or work commitments.

There is no ‘down time’ in the scholarship program, you will go from teleconferences to meetings, workshops to functions and in-between you’ll work on your personal goals and project outcomes – the scholarship is a true 24/7/365 approach to learning.



4. LEARNING THROUGH DOING: and a project to boot.

The scholarship is designed around a series of teleconferences, personal development workshops and a project of your choice, with other learning or promotional opportunities arising during the course of the scholarship at state and national level.

Your project of choice is an important element of the scholarship. You will come into the scholarship understanding issues that face surf life saving and the project provides an opportunity to address one of these issues. The project gives you an opportunity to work on an area of interest and to really make a difference. You will form a close relationship with the relevant areas for your project (ie National, State, Branch bodies and/or other surrounding sources). You will be required to work together with your State/Territory in preparing a project framework which you can work through from research to recommendations. Your state centre will be there to assist and support you through your scholarship journey. It is encouraged that you report with your State/Territory on regular occasions so you can both maximise the Sir Adrian Curlewis Scholarship opportunity and ensure key timelines and goals are being met.

The project will provide valuable insight into the processes and procedures within surf life saving and will provide you with the skills and confidence to conduct successful projects within the organisation in the future.

5. WHAT YOU NEED TO BE A SCHOLAR.

Applicants for the Sir Adrian Curlewis Scholarship should:

- Be a minimum of 21 years of age and a member of a SLSA club at the time of application.
- Have attended a National Leadership College (or similar).
- Possess well-developed oral and written communication skills.
- Have demonstrated a record of performance in leadership roles, either within or outside surf life saving and show potential for leadership within SLSA.
- Have an understanding of issues facing surf life saving.
- Be an active patrolling member of a club.
- Understand that leadership in surf life saving is an opportunity to work as part of a team towards a common goal.



6. WHAT / WHEN / WHERE.

As a scholar you will need to commit yourself to a full year of events, workshops and deadlines. You will be responsible for your own self development and it is assumed that at the least you will meet the national scholarship schedule below (see table) on top of other opportunities at state level. 100% participation will be an integral part of the discipline you will need to show as part of your own pathway of growth both personally and as a leader in surf life saving.
