Final Carnival Circular

1. INTRODUCTION

Thank you for entering Wanda SLSC’s 9th Annual Tradies “One Club” Carnival.

Our Club is looking forward to hosting your club, competitors, officials, water safety, and spectators and hope that all have a most enjoyable day.

This year events will again be conducted in the U8 to O40 age categories plus inclusive events.

This Circular details some important information. Please take a moment to familiarise you with the content.

If not already undertaken please also complete the following “Must Do” registrations ASAP prior to the Carnival:

The Wanda SLSC Tradies One Club Carnival is using “Live Heats” again this year (refer Section 4).

2. CARNIVAL PRECINCT AND PARKING

There is no council paid parking around Wanda Beach and parking right at the beach front can become limited at busy times.

3 hour parking is available along sections of the seaward side of Mitchell Road and all day parking is available on other streets within 400 metres of the Wanda SLSC Clubhouse.

Overflow Trailer Parking (with or without tow vehicle attached) and designated Club Buses will be available at the corner of Hume and Mitchell Roads Cronulla.

In addition, there will be a craft drop off zone established adjacent to the Sutherland Lifeguard Centre adjacent to the Wanda Clubhouse.

The parking directly in front of the clubhouse will be strictly reserved for invited guests, stall holders, for mobility parking permit holders (but only if there are vacant disability spaces) and for emergency and service access only. Please follow and respect all directions of the Wanda SLSC volunteers.

3. INFECTIOUS DISEASE CONTROL

There are no particular infectious disease safety plans for this year's carnival other than a request that if any participant or spectator has tested positive to COVID or feels unwell in any way, please consider others, and do not attend the Carnival.

4. LIVE HEATS AND EVENT REGISTRATION

The Registration Tents will be in the Carnival Village that is located on the grass Area located between the Wanda SLSC Clubhouse and the Sutherland Shire Council Lifeguard Centre.

Registration will open at 6:15am.

Wanda SLSC is again using "*LiveHeats*" again this year (refer Section 4) in all events and Ages except R&R teams.

LiveHeats is a "real time" event management system that assists organisers to manage entries, determine the rounds of events, and final results etc. Participants may follow their progress in competition using Live heats and record their results. For a demonstration of the technology please refer to <https://www.liveheats.com>.

With the exception of those requiring seeking a new or replacement Live Heats wristband, all competitors may proceed directly to their respective areas and, wearing their Live Heats wristband, and report for event marshalling when called.

R&R competitors (who do not require a wrist band unless entering into other events) may report directly to their area for competition unless a late entry and/or a new or replacement wrist band is required to participate in other events.

Surf Life Saving Sydney charges \$5.00 for a wrist band for those new competitors not previously registered with Live Heats. For those requiring a replacement wrist band the fee is \$10.00. The fee for a new or replacement wristband is in addition to entry fees.

Live Heats will also be used to maintain the Tradies Club Point Score calculation (the R&R and boat events (that will be conducted on 19 October 2024) will be entered manually).

Clubs are reminded that all entries fees must be paid before or on the day of competition. Payment (via EFTPOS) or other agreed method will be accepted at the Registration Tent (also refer Section 14).

Please also note that no late entries will be accepted on the day of the Carnival (please also refer to Section 17).

5. BEACH SET UP

There has been some sand erosion in the past two months. Wanda SLSC requests the cooperation of all participants with club tent placement and craft storage.

The Water Arenas are numbered 4 to 1 from south to north. Beach conditions permitting Arenas 4 and 3 will be centred in front of Wanda SLSC and then moving north to Arenas 2 and 1. The Beach Arena will be just to the south of the club. It is proposed that the U8 competition will be conducted to the south of Area 4 and the R&R area to the north of Area 1 (TBC). It is proposed that the 2km Runs and the 2km paddle start and finish from in front of the Wanda club house.

- Water Arena 3: U14 to Masters Women
- Water Arena 2: U11 to U13 Water Men and Women
- Water Arena 1: U9 to U11 Water Men and Women.

8. COMPETITOR REPORT AND START TIMES

Event Registration for all shall commence at 6:15 am.

Marshalling and start times shall be:

- Beach Runs: 6.45 am Marshall and 7.00am start
- 2km Ski Challenge: 7.05 am Marshall, 7.15 am in water, & 7.30 am start
- U9 – O40 Water Events: 7.30 am Marshall and 8:.0am start
- All R&R: 7.30 am Marshall and 8.00am start
- U9 and U10 Beach Events: 7.30 am Marshall and 9.00am start
- Inclusive Events: 7.30am Marshall and 8.00am (see also beach runs)
- U8 Events 8.00am Marshall and 8.30am start
- U14 to O40 B Beach Events 9.30am Marshall and 10.00 am start

- U11 to U13 Beach Events: 11.00 am Marshall and 11.00am star

Note: Wanda SLSC is hopeful of good conditions for competition. The tides are favourable and beach has returned but it still may be required to adjust the timing of some events. Every endeavour will be taken to communicate any major changes to participating clubs prior to the day of the Carnival.

9. JAG WATER SAFETY

Sydney Branch Clubs must provide proficient water safety personnel on a one to 7 competitor ratio for their U8- U13 (and U14 non SRC competitors) competitors. Other Competing Clubs are also requested to assist.

Note: Inclusive event participants entering the water will require one to one water safety provided by the competitor's club.

If required clubs will be requested to provide further assistance on the day to ensure there is sufficient water safety for competitors.

The main Water Safety Officials Briefing shall take place at 7:30am outside the Wanda SLSC Club House. Any further briefings and reporting shall be in the allocated water arenas.

When reporting for duty please remember to bring your own orange Water Safety rash shirt and cap and, if possible, it would be helpful to bring your rescue tube or board. Please also remember to bring protective clothing, sunscreen, and a water bottle (for refills).

Breakfast, morning tea, lunch (in the downstairs bar area) and a debrief will be offered to working water safety personnel.

Note: Inclusive event participants entering the water will require one to one water safety provided by the competitor's club.

10. IRB ASSISTANCE

Clubs with 50 or more competitors registered to compete must provide one proficient IRB Driver and Crew.

Note: There is no need to bring an IRB to the Carnival. Wanda SLSC will provide the IRBs – we just need drivers and crew.

The IRB Driver and Crew Briefing shall take place at 7:30am outside the Wanda SLSC Club House. Any further briefings and reporting shall be in the allocated water arenas.

When reporting for duty please remember to bring your Personal Protective Equipment (Wetsuit, Lifejacket, and Helmet, protective clothing, etc). as well as sunscreen, and a water bottle (for refills).

Breakfast, morning tea, lunch (in the downstairs bar area) and a debrief will be offered to working IRB personnel.

11. COMPETITION OFFICIALS

All competing Clubs must provide Officials on a one to 15 competitor ratio.

If required clubs will be requested to provide further assistance on the day to ensure there are sufficient officials to conduct the Carnival.

The Officials Briefings times and locations are detailed in Section 8.

When reporting for duty please remember to bring your bring protective clothing, name tag, sunscreen, and a water bottle (for refills).

Breakfast, morning tea, lunch (in the downstairs bar area) and a debrief will be offered to working water safety personnel.

12. CARNIVAL VILLAGE

The “Tradies One Club Carnival Village” is to be established on the grass between the Wanda Clubhouse and the Lifeguard Administration area.

In that area will be Event Registrations, the Club BBQ, Snow Cones, and stall holders from Engine, Nissan Sutherland, IMB, and the Wanda apparel Caravan. The Wanda Café will be in operation and will be the coffee vendor.

Please take a moment to go to the village and support the Wanda Club, Stall Holders, BBQ, and Café.

In addition, winner’s prizes will be available for collection in front of the clubhouse and, from about 12.30 pm at the conclusion of the Carnival, it is planned to have random sponsor product lucky draw giveaways including an Infront “Foamie” Nipper Board.

13. MEDALS, PRIZES AND PRIZE MONEY

First, Second and Third place medallions will be offered to place getters in U9 to U13 age individual and team events. Voodoo Dry or Tradies One Club Caps will also be handed awarded to winners.

Placing and Participation medals will also be offered for all Inclusive competitors and U8 participants.

Random Giveaway prizes will also be awarded to lucky competitors.

Please refer to the attached list for details of prizes and prize money for Open Age Events and the prizes for the U14 Ironman and Ironwoman.

Please Note that as per SLSNSW requirements relating to insurance, any prize money won must be paid to clubs. This will be attended to following the Carnival.

14. CLUBHOUSE ACCESS AND DOWNSTAIRS BAR AREA

A private function has been booked for the upstairs Founders Room in the afternoon. As such no access will be permitted to the Room or the upstairs balcony area except for some morning access only by specially invited VIPs. Please respect this instruction.

The downstairs bar area will be open from 11 am and officials, water safety and all participants are welcome to attend.

The usual licensing arrangements will also apply.

The area will cease operation at about 5:00pm.

15. SAFETY AND CONTINGENCY PLANS

Safety Plans have been prepared and are available upon request.

In the event of adverse conditions, the area around Silver Beach at Kurnell and Cronulla Beach has been identified as back-up venues. An assessment will be made in the days just prior to 28 October 2023 and, where possible, advance notice will be given to competing clubs via the contact email and social media.

The hierarchy of possible relocations are via the water competition from U9 and 10 through to U17, then Masters and finally Open competitors. It is anticipated that all beach events will remain at Wanda Beach.

17. ENTRY FEES, LIVEHEATS WRIST BANDS, AND PAYMENT

The standard entry fee are as follows:

- \$30 per individual competitor shall apply for the U9 to O40 years age groups.
- \$20 per individual competitor shall apply for the U8 years age group.
- Entry for Inclusive Competitors are free.
- R&R Team Entry of \$55.00 per Team with the following exceptions:
 - Should one or both competitors in the 2 Person R&R enter events in addition to the 2 Person R&R there is no individual competitor fee payable.
 - Should one or both competitors in the 5/6 Person R&R enter events other than R&R the additional individual competitor fee is \$15.00 per person.

Note: No late entries will be accepted on the day of the Carnival (see also Section 14). However, please contact the Wanda office (9523 4343) prior to Thursday, 24 October 2024 if you wish to register any competitor as a special matter. A \$15 additional late entry fee may apply for each competitor.

Wanda SLSC must receive all entry fees on or before the date of the Carnival for a Club to be eligible to compete.

As detailed in Section 4 Surf Life Saving Sydney charges \$5.00 for a wrist band for new competitors not previously registered with Live Heats. For those requiring a replacement wrist band the fee is \$10.00.

Note: The fee for a new or replacement wristband is in addition to entry fees.
